(Genesis 26:31) . . . promised **one another**

(Leviticus 19:11) . . . do not steal, nor deal falsely, nor lie to **one another**

(Leviticus 25:14) . . . you shall not wrong **one another**

(1 Samuel 20:41) . . . weep with **one another**

(1 Samuel 21:11) . . . sing to **one another**

(2 Chronicles 25:17) . . . look **one another** in the face

(Esther 9:19) . . . send choice portions to **one another**

(Ezekiel 24:23) . . . groan to **one another**

(Zechariah 8:16) . . . speak the truth to **one another**

(Zechariah 8:17) . . . do not devise evil in your hearts against **one another**

(Mark 8:16) . . . discuss with **one another**

(Mark 9:50) . . . be at peace with **one another**

(Luke 22:23) . . . question **one another**

(John 13:34) . . . love **one another**

(Acts 4:15) . . . confer with **one another**

(Acts 21:5) . . . kneeling down on the beach we prayed for **one another** and bade each other farewell

(Romans 12:10) . . . outdo **one another** in showing honor

(Romans 12:16) . . . live in harmony with **one another**

(Romans 13:8) . . . love **one another**; for he who loves his neighbor has fulfilled the law

(Romans 14:13) . . . let us no more pass judgment on **one another**

(Romans 15:5) . . . live in harmony with **one another**

(Romans 15:7) . . . welcome **one another**

(Romans 15:14) . . . instruct **one another**

(Romans 16:16) . . . greet **one another** with a holy kiss

(1 Corinthians 12:25) . . .that there may be no discord , let members may have the same care for **one another**

(2 Corinthians 13:11) . . . agree with **one another**, live in peace, and the God of peace will be with you

(Galatians 5:13) . . . be servants of **one another**

(Galatians 5:26) . . . do not provoke **one another**, have no envy of **each other**

(Ephesians 4:2) . . . with all lowliness and meekness, with patience, forbearing **one another** in love

(Ephesians 4:32) . . . and be kind to **one another**, tenderhearted, forgiving **one another**

(Ephesians 5:19) . . . addressing **one another** in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs

(Ephesians 5:21) . . . be subject to **one another** out of reverence for Christ.

(Colossians 3:9) . . . do not lie to **one another**, see that you have put off the old nature with its practices

(Colossians 3:13) . . . forbear **one another** and if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other

(Colossians 3:16) . . . teach and admonish **one another** in all wisdom

(1 Thessalonians 3:12) . . . increase and abound in love to **one another**

(1 Thessalonians 4:9) . . . you yourselves have been taught by God to love **one another**

(1 Thessalonians 4:18) . . . comfort **one another** with these words

(1 Thessalonians 5:11) . . . encourage **one another** and build **one another** up, just as you are doing

(1 Thessalonians 5:15) . . . always seek to do good to **one another**

(2 Thessalonians 1:3) . . . your faith is growing abundantly, and your love for **one another** is increasing

(Hebrews 3:13) . . . exhort **one another** every day

(Hebrews 10:24) . . . let us consider how to stir up **one another** to love and good works

(Hebrews 10:25) . . . not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging **one another**

(James 4:11) . . . do not speak evil against **one another**

(James 5:9) . . . do not grumble against **one another**

(James 5:16) confess your sins to **one another** and pray for **one another**

(1 Peter 1:22) . . . having purified your souls by your obedience . . . love **one another** earnestly

(1 Peter 4:8) . . . above all hold unfailing your love for **one another**, since love covers a multitude of sins

(1 Peter 4:9) . . . practice hospitality ungrudgingly to **one another**

(1 Peter 4:10) . . . as each has received a gift, employ it for **one another** as good stewards of God's grace

(1 Peter 5:5) . . . clothe yourselves with humility toward **one another**

(1 Peter 5:14) . . . greet **one another** with the kiss of love

(1 John 1:7) . . . have fellowship with **one another**

(1 John 4:7) . . . let us love **one another**; for love is of God, and he who loves is born of God and knows God

(Leviticus 25:14) . . . do not take advantage of **each other**

(Leviticus 25:17) . . . do not take advantage of **each other**

(1 Samuel 20:41) . . . they kissed **each other** and wept together

(1 Samuel 20:42) . . . we have sworn friendship with **each other** in the name of the LORD

(Zechariah 7:10) . . . in your hearts do not think evil of **each other**

(Zechariah 8:16) . . . speak the truth to **each other**, and render true and sound judgment

(Malachi 3:16) . . . talk with **each other**

(John 15:17) . . . this is my command: love **each other**

(1 Corinthians 12:25) . . . in the body, all parts should have equal concern for **each other**

(Ephesians 4:32) . . . be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving **each other**

(Philippians 4:2) . . . agree with **each other** in the Lord

(Colossians 3:9) . . . do not lie to **each other**, since you have taken off your old self with its practices

(Colossians 3:13) . . . bear with **each other** and forgive whatever grievances you may have

(1 Thessalonians 3:12) . . . let your love increase and overflow for **each other**

(1 Thessalonians 5:13) . . . live in peace with **each other**

(1 Thessalonians 5:15) . . . always try to be kind to **each other** and to everyone else
(Hebrews 13:1) . . . keep on loving **each other** as brothers
